## Phone Features



## Setting Up Your Phone

During the onscreen instructions for set-up, you have the option to select from two different modes. If you did not make a selection, the default mode is Standard.

**Starter mode:** Simplified and easier experience for the first time smartphone user. If selected, your Home Screen will show as follows.

**Standard mode:** General-standard experience for users who are familiar with Android. If selected, your Home Screen will show as follows.

Follow the onscreen instructions to quickly set up your phone and email accounts.

## Inserting the SIM /microSD Cards

NOTE: The microSD card is sold separately. If not already inserted, follow the instructions below to insert your 4G SIM Card.

1. If the smartphone is on, press and hold the Power/Lock Key  and tap **Power off** to turn it off.
2. Remove the battery cover. Use the groove at the bottom of the smartphone to lift the cover and remove.
3. Position the microSD and SIM cards with the logos facing up and slide them into place until they are fully inserted.
4. Insert the battery into the battery compartment with the contacts aligned and push the battery down until it clicks into place.
5. Replace the cover inserting the top of the cover and pressing downward on the sides and bottom until it clicks into place.

## Removing the SIM Card

1. Turn off the phone and remove the battery cover and battery.
2. Locate the SIM Card slot and gently pull the SIM Card out to remove it.

## Removing the microSD Card

1. Before removing the memory card, first unmount it for safe removal. Tap **Apps**  on the Home screen, and choose **Settings > Storage > Unmount SD card**.
2. Turn off the smartphone and remove the battery cover and battery.
3. Gently pull the microSD card out to remove it.

## Turning the Smartphone On and Off

1. Press and hold the Power/Lock Key  for a few seconds until the screen lights up.
2. To turn the Smartphone off, press and hold the Power/Lock Key , then tap **Power off** in the popup menu that appears.
  - If your screen turns off, press the Power/Lock Key  to turn it back on.

## Switching Modes

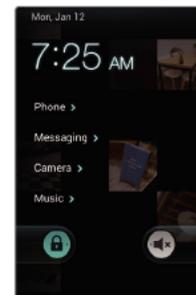
1. From the Home Screen, tap **Apps**  > **Settings > Mode change**. Then, tap the desired mode and tap **OK**.

## Locking and Unlocking the Smartphone

When not in use, lock the smartphone to prevent unwanted operation. Pressing the Power/Lock Key  turns the screen off and puts the smartphone in lock mode.

The smartphone automatically locks if it is not used for a specified period.

To unlock the Smartphone, press the Power/Lock Key  or Volume Key to turn the screen on, then swipe the lock icon . To use a shortcut, tap the desired option. The screen will unlock and launch the application.



## Making/Receiving a Call

1. From the Home Screen, tap **Phone** to open the dial pad.
2. Enter the phone number.
3. Tap to dial the number that you entered.
4. Tap **END** to end the call.
5. To receive a call, tap **Answer**.

## Motion Dialer

Tilting or flipping the dialpad with a flick of the wrist changes it into the speed dialpad for quick access to your saved speed dial entries. To activate this feature, tap **Phone** > **Dialpad gesture**, and choose **Motion-tilt** or **Motion-flip**.



## Ringtones

1. From the Home Screen, tap **Apps** > **Settings** > **Sound** > **Phone ringtone**.
2. Tap the ringtone to listen to and select the desired tone.
3. Tap **OK** to save your setting.

## Pairing with a Bluetooth® Device

1. From the Home screen, tap **Apps** > **Settings** > **Bluetooth**.
2. Tap the switch in the upper right corner to turn Bluetooth on.
3. Tap **SEARCH FOR DEVICES** to search for and display information about nearby Bluetooth devices.
4. Tap the name of the device you want to pair your smartphone.

NOTE: Depending on the type of device you are pairing with, you will be asked to enter a passkey, confirm matching passkeys, or the device will automatically pair.

## Motion Sense

Motion Sense allows you to use hand motions to control the phone without touching it. A simple wave of the hand over the Proximity sensor on your phone allows for touch-free control to answer calls, view the previous or next message, picture or song. Or cover the screen with a palm to pause music playback.

## NFC

Near field communication (NFC) lets you tap your phone on NFC touchpoints as shortcuts for more complex actions. For example, you can quickly change your phone settings, or open a website featured on an advertising poster without typing the Web address. To turn on NFC, from the Home screen tap **Apps** > **Settings** > **More**, and tap the NFC checkbox.

## Bluetooth® Easy Pair

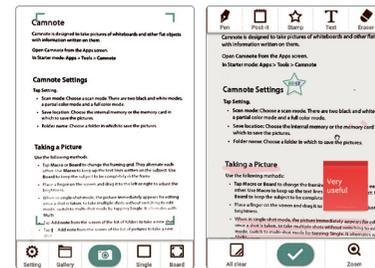
NFC makes it easier to pair your smartphone with an NFC-enabled Bluetooth device. Now, you can pair to an NFC capable Bluetooth headset, for example, without having to go through the phone's menus.

1. With NFC enabled, place your smartphone next to the NFC compatible Bluetooth device to pair.
2. Tap **OK** when you are asked to confirm to pair with the device.
3. Tap **OK** to finish the pairing process.

## Camnote

Camnote lets users add text and perform other modifications on images taken by the device.

1. To use Camnote, from the Home screen tap **Apps** > **Camnote**.
2. Hold the rear camera lens over the desired text or image and press the camera shutter.
3. When in single-shot mode, the picture immediately appears for editing once a shot is taken. Using pen, text, stamp or other options, edit the scanned image.
4. Touch the when complete to save.
5. You can save to phone memory or share you image via text message, email, etc.

## Setting Up Other Email Accounts

1. From the Home screen tap **Apps** > **Settings** > **Accounts & sync**.
2. Tap **ADD ACCOUNT** and select the desired provider.
3. Enter your email address and password and any other necessary login credentials to sign in.

## Set Up Voice Mail

From the Home screen, tap **Phone**. Dial \*86 and tap . If you hear a greeting, press # to interrupt, and follow the setup tutorial.

## Access Voice Mail

From your phone—press \*86 and **Send**. From the Home screen, tap **Phone**. Dial \*86 and tap .

When you hear the greeting, press # to interrupt, follow the prompts. From any phone—dial your wireless number. When you hear the greeting, press # to interrupt, follow the prompts.

NOTE: Voice mail boxes not set up within 45 days will be canceled. Your voice mail box is not password protected until you create a password by following the setup tutorial.

## Visual Voice Mail

View a list of messages without dialing into a mailbox. Listen or erase with the touch of a button.

Take the Internet on the go. You can reach the latest news, get the weather and follow your stocks. From the Home Screen, tap **Browser**.

## Location Based Services

This phone can determine its location, which is useful for services such as navigation, shopping and weather. For your safety, it's defaulted to only acquire your location when you dial 911. To use Location Based Services, go to **Settings & Tools**.
